To ensure learning continues, we ask that you complete the following work. You **must** choose 4 maths, 4 literacy and 4 topic homework assignments. Assignments should be completed in your red homework book, you may also like to send a picture of your work, we would love to see what you are doing. Additionally, we are continuing the expectation that children continue to read daily and practise their times tables. If you choose to do extra at home that is fantastic! Extra house points will be awarded for children who complete more than 4 pieces of work for each subject.

Times Tables

Children are expected to continue practising their times tables. This can be completed on Times Tables Rock Stars, or by playing small multiplication games. For example, beat the calculator!

A new way to practise your times tables is by making a board game! Can you think of a creative way of playing a board game and practising your times tables at the same time?

Reading

Inside your child's homework book there are some useful top tips to help you support their reading. Discussing books, you have read is just as important as reading at home.

Wellbeing
